**Please Note:**

- If the individual can safely **self-administer medications or receives assistance with self-administration**, MRDD personnel are **NOT** required to have medication administration certification. (5123:2-6-02)
  
- If the **individual lives with a family member who is the primary caregiver, the family member can delegate medication administration to an INDIVIDUAL provider** (not to employees of an agency). The family member is responsible for training and supervising the provider, and the provider is **NOT** required to have medication administration certification. (ORC 5123.47 Family Delegation)

<p><b>5123:2-6-03(B)(4)</b> In the case of individuals receiving services from certified supported living providers, if the services are offered or provided pursuant to Chapter 5123 or 5126 of the Revised Code, all of the following apply:</p> <p>(a) Without nursing delegation, MR/DD personnel may perform health-related activities.</p> <p>(b) Without nursing delegation, MR/DD personnel may administer oral and topical prescribed medications.</p> <p>(c) <b>With nursing delegation, MR/DD personnel may administer prescribed medications through gastrostomy and jejunostomy tubes, if the tubes being used are stable and labeled.</b></p> <p>(d) <b>With nursing delegation, MR/DD personnel may perform routine tube feedings, if the gastrostomy and jejunostomy tubes being used are stable and labeled.</b></p>		

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
